## Appendix 1

At its meeting held on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> February the Council voted unanimously to oppose the application 20232/92489/REM seeking approval of reserved matters with regard to the development on Sub Road, Butleigh. The 10 members of the parish present subsequently voted unanimously to support the Council's decision.

In coming to its decision, the Council noted that the plan submitted in support of the application was substantially and materially different to that submitted in the original

In coming to its decision, the Council noted that the plan submitted in support of the application was substantially and materially different to that submitted in the original application on which the Inspector granted permission. The Council re-affirmed its objections on the following grounds:

- 1. The proposed "cut and fill" works to meet the requirement re roof levels, while addressing the issue of the housing closest to Barton Road, merely pushes the problem onto the northern boundary of the site. Thus, the proposed level of the housing adjacent to Holm Oaks will be higher than the existing fence level.
- 2. The current plan removes the provision of landscaping (trees) between the new housing and the existing housing (Holm Oaks) on the northern boundary and on Sub Road.
- 3. We believe that the new proposed drainage system will prove to be inadequate and cause flooding elsewhere in the village.
- 4. The proposed phosphate mitigation is untested and unproven.
- 5. In order to meet one of the requirements set by the Inspector, the plan envisages a pedestrian access/through the Holme Oaks' play area The land in question is owned by the Council and leased to the Butleigh Playing Fields Association in order to provide a safe play area for the Community. The Council discussed its concerns about the proposed access with the Developers and invited them to come back with some fresh proposals. To date we have not had a reply. The Council will not consider giving permission for pedestrian access until its concerns re the safety of the young people using the play area; the provision of suitable landscaping; the ongoing maintenance of the proposed access pathway; and its concerns re the impact of the proposed new housing on the houses adjacent in Holm Oaks are met.

On these grounds, together with the detailed objections lodged by a number of individuals within the community, the Council re-affirms its objections to the proposals contained in the application.
